Self-Directed Learning Activities for the PRISE Program

Residents should complete a minimum of 2 open activities during their time in PRISE. We recommend that one of these be the Stanford Writing in the Sciences Course, free via Coursera, but residents may choose the options they prefer.

Additional activities/items may count towards this requirement pending PRISE Co-Director approval. The following list is **not** comprehensive.

- Complete: <u>Design and Interpretation of Clinical Trials</u> from Johns Hopkins University (available anytime from Coursera)
- Complete: Responsible Conduct of Research from Emory University School of Medicine's Office of Postdoctoral Education (occurs in Spring, 4 sessions, 2 hours each, usually spread across Jan., Feb., and March)
- Complete: Quality at the Data Level course from the Georgia Institute for Translational Research (available anytime)
- Complete: <u>Quality by Design at the Clinical Level</u> course from the Georgia Institute for Translational Research (available anytime)
- Complete: <u>Diversity in Clinical Trials</u> course from the Georgia Institute for Translational Research (available anytime)
- Attend a <u>Research Survival Workshop</u> (topic and availability change, check periodically)
- Participate in a <u>Clinical Research Bootcamp</u> (usually occurs in April, approx. 1 full day. One course is offered per year, rotating over a 3-year period)
- Participate in a <u>SOM Career Development for Faculty</u> (including FAALI Series) event (dependent on topic, check periodically)
- Participate in an Office of Postdoctoral Education <u>Grants Toolkit</u> event/activity (topic and availability change, check periodically)
- Attend a Department of Pediatrics <u>FIRsT session</u> (dependent on topic, check periodically)
- Attend a K-Club session (dependent on topic, check periodically
